

<p>Reading: Name of- class reader: Tom's Midnight Garden</p> <p>Reading: Skills taught prediction, summarising, inference and questioning. The children will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Discuss characters and events • Recognise and read common exception words for Year 3/4 and start to recognise common exception words for Year 5/6. • Use phonic knowledge to read words 	<p>Writing:</p> <p>Fiction: The children will be looking at familiar stories linking to our learning theme. They will be focusing on recapping their spelling, punctuation, and grammar from Year 4, and using this effectively in their writing. As well as the basics, we will focus on using figurative language and a variety of sentence starters and expanded noun phrases.</p> <p>Non-Fiction: Non-chronological report: Children will look at the layout and features of a non-chronological report. Children will then use this format to write their own non-chronological report. Children will look at other examples in printed information texts, as well as form a short argument for a debate.</p> <p>We will focus on:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Building cohesion within and across paragraphs • Creating atmosphere in narrative • Using non-standard English in writing dialogue 	<p>Religious Education</p> <p>The theme is Christianity:</p> <p>What does it mean if God is loving and holy? The children will:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify some different types of biblical texts, using technical terms accurately. • Explain connections between biblical texts and Christian ideas of God, using theological terms. • Make clear connections between Bible texts studied and what Christians believe about God, for example, through how churches are designed. • Show how Christians put their beliefs into practice in worship. • Weigh up how biblical ideas and teachings about God as holy and loving might make a difference in the world today, developing insights of their own. 	<p>Mathematics: In mathematics this half term we will look at 'Place value and 'addition and subtraction.'
